HMES School Authority Profile

Hillcrest Montessori Elementary School is a not-for-profit independent school proud to be celebrating its 10th anniversary year from its founding date. The school is accredited by Alberta Education offering junior kindergarten, kindergarten, and elementary programs. We pride ourselves on offering an inclusive education that meets the needs of both gifted and special students. HMES is also serviced with an out-of-school care program upon request. Our enrollment comprises of 22 pre-kindergarten to kindergarten children and 9 elementary students in grades one through six. At the pre-kindergarten level, the children are team-taught by a Montessori guide (teacher) and a Montessori-trained/Alberta Ed certificated teacher. The elementary classroom is led by a Montessori guide/Alberta Education certificated teacher. The preschool and kindergarten classroom environments are conducted in English. All ECS students attend school for 5 days per week.

The foundational basis of our instruction is the Montessori method espoused by Dr. Maria Montessori. This method of instruction emphasizes a hands on approach to learning, starting from concrete to abstract, with students creating an everlasting muscle memory that will lay a strong foundation for an ongoing education for LIFE. In order to ensure that we meet the Alberta Education Curriculum, our Kindergarten Program of Studies and the Alberta Education Program of Studies, our Montessori curriculum is fully aligned with the Alberta Education set requirements.

School Authority Planning & Reporting

Based on the data collected from previous Education Plan outcomes, and local measures, HMES has identified additional areas of improvement that will continue to be developed. HMES continues to work toward a higher level of participation amongst parents and community partners. We are increasingly finding ways to get both parents and local community members be involved in the strategic planning of the the school through PAC meetings and local stakeholder engagements, and getting expert advise from interoperable organizations, Results over the past years have demonstrated that parents require more motivation to become more engaged in school life through PAC initiated activities Parent Information Nights, Student Lead Conferences, School Society Recreational Club and Montessori Family Alliance and curricular events. Results from the Early Years Literacy & Numeracy Assessments reported in the 2023/2024 AERR indicated that most students in the Elementary cohort are meeting or exceeding grade level expectations and a continued commitment to maintaining high achievement and providing support for students at-risk.



Montessori EducationPsychological Well-being



Hillcrest Montessori Elementary School (HMES) has operated out of the historical former Birchwood School building since 2018. HMES was accredited by Alberta education initially as an ECS Kindergarten program in 2019. Backing into the Birchwood Trails, the building creates breathtaking indoor and outdoor nature-based classrooms, with trails and forest for outdoor activities and fitness programs. We will deliberately seek to create a campus of timeless natural beauty that communicates to our students that the buildings and grounds are expressions of our love and commitment to their education and success.

As of Sept 2020, The Government of Alberta accredited HMES as an independent school offering programs for preschool (ages 3 and 4) through to Grade 6. HMES partnered with the International Montessori Council (IMC) to work on its accreditation status. Using the IMC Montessori principles, HMES is fully committed to following the Alberta Program of Studies in order to set standards stipulated by the Alberta Education.

HMES is steadily working towards graduating a grade each year to promote continued enrolment growth in all programs, with particular emphasis on the Upper Elementary program (Gr4-6) Which we hope to grow into a Junior High School in 2026-2027 school year.

HMES serves families residing in the local thick wood area surrounding the Birchwood trails, Timberlea area, the downtown area, Gregoire areas with the furthest family traveling from Saprae Creek 23km from the school.

Students with identified special education codes are supported within HMES inclusive classrooms. Each class is led by a teacher with both Alberta Teaching Certification and MACTE Montessori Guide training and is supported by a Montessori Assistant, and when necessary, an Educational Assistant to further support student needs and diverse Learning Styles. We acknowledge that children learn in different ways and at different paces. Our goal is to view each child as a unique human being and to be as flexible as possible in addressing his or her learning style and needs as an individual learner. We also seek to provide an environment open to students with diverse learning styles, while our primary focus will always be the well-being and best interests of those students who will thrive in our Montessori environment. In every case, we assess whether our school is able to meet a student's needs, while keeping the integrity of the classroom.





STAKEHOLDER ENGAGEMENT



We recognize that a Montessori school is more than a place of learning, it is a community of children and adults that has a significant impact on our students' capacity to learn, grow, create, develop, assimilate values, and relate peacefully and respectfully to other people and to the natural world.



Throughout the year we encouraged parents to participate in programs that can help them to refine their parenting strategies, to facilitate the development of independence, responsibility, self-confidence and self- respect in their sons and daughters, and in themselves. We recognize parenting as an extremely difficult, rewarding and valuable job for which we have had little preparation and for which, in the modern world, we get little support. We committed and provided ways to provide that support for families from birth through adulthood by the creation of a parenting center that includes parenting classes currently individually based as on each family's need.

The **Ambassador Parent Program**: We understand the special needs of new participants in the community and the necessity of a program to match new families with ones experienced in the community to provide support and information.

Short term goal:

- We have created ongoing support groups, and a parenting library and Class Community Meetings
- There are also two formally scheduled Parent Teacher Conferences within the school calendar to communicate specific, individualized feedback and a commentary on student progress.
- Parents contributed to strategic planning through Parent Advisory Council meetings.
- Multiple community-based agencies such as Birchwood Circle of care, Providence, Khan Academy Occupational Therapy, Sound Speech Pathology
 provide input to Individual Program Plans and future direction of learner supports.

FOSTERING ENGAGEMENT WITH THE INDIGENOUS COMMUNITY



Initiatives to support First Nations, Métis, and Inuit student success within Hillcrest Montessori Elementary School

In 2022-2023, Hillcrest Montessori Elementary School had 1 student who selfidentified as an Indigenous student, and as we enter the 2024 -2025 HMES now has 4. Within this period we have worked with our staff and the student's family to enhance our programs to ensure success for the aforementioned Indigenous students and any future Indigenous students we may receive. Hillcrest Montessori Elementary School used the Montessori approach to education by focusing on sensitive periods, a prepared environment, sensory education, and spontaneous activity through repetition. During sensitive periods, the students are encouraged to let go of everything else and focus on aspects of their education. This increases their levels of concentration and attention span. A prepared environment planned activities and calendars bring consistency to the students and reduce stress associated with uncertainty and transitions. Sensory education bolsters the development of the students' senses and increases their curiosity. This like every other aspect should be age-appropriate and lead to the discovery of new things such as the results of science experiments. Through repetition, learning is reinforced and the excitement is maintained in spontaneity. For all this to work, Hillcrest Montessori Elementary School would work with the parents and guardians of the students and consider the impact of culture learning.





The Truth and Reconciliation Commission recommends that we all have a part to play to create a Canada in which all people are equal at social, health and economic outcomes. At Hillcrest Montessori Elementary School, we support these recommendations by ensuring that all students are respected and given the opportunity and resources required to succeed. Through the Montessori approach to education, it is even more applicable because Montessori philosophy dictates that an individual approach to education yields the most results as it meets the student at their point of need. This helps the students because a teaching guide takes each student through the curriculum at a pace which ensures success rather than the standard teaching method that may leave slower learners behind.

By celebrating the Orange Shirt Day and National Indigenous People's Day, acknowledgments at school ceremonies First Nations students feel their culture is recognized, respected and represented at Hillcrest Montessori Elementary School. Furthermore, some of school staff members were privileged to attend a Metis training course at Metis Crossing at which they were inculcated the way of life of the Metis people. This assisted them in delivering more relevant, accurate and inspiring teaching of the indigenous people.

PRIORITY 2 - STRATEGIES



STRATEGIES

- ·Introduce math clubs and non-competitive fairs at the school to provide platforms from students to train and showcase their numeracy skills
- ·Introduce non-competitive drama, theatre and poetry programs to enhance the student's appreciation, understanding and desire for literacy skills
- •The school will work with trained and qualified specialists such as Speech and Language Pathologists to conduct early assessments for students so as identify any supports required for education
- ·Home reading programs will be introduced whereby students will be given set reading plans to follow which will be signed off by parents once attained
- ·A reading buddy system will be made available which will see senior students partnered with juniors so as to improve both categories' literacy skills. This teaching method aligns with the Montessori Philosophy
- •The students will be given an opportunity to run the school store which will provide them with a real-world application of math and literacy

The school will partner with the Wood Buffalo Library to create a satellite city library within the school library as well as having a representative from the city library do monthly book reading. This will pique the students' interest in reading


